

staged readings of every Shakespeare play in his iconic Clayfield home of 70 years, but had never performed in a film. Until now. Watch his cinematic debut in *NOT TO BE*, a short film telling the story of an eccentric Shakespearean actor who decides that this performance will be his final curtain call. Directed by *Katrina Channells* and co-written with *Joe Hinchliffe*, *Not To Be* has been officially selected for Hollywood Shortsfest, New York Indie Shorts Awards, Venezia Shorts Italy, and more. The screening will also include a short documentary on Bryan.

Local Shakespearean actors **John McNeill** (festival regular) and **Nicky Whichelow** (Royal Shakespeare Company) will then bring the Bard's words to life in readings, alongside a discussion of Shakespeare's role in society.
